

Linus Pauling Institute



The Linus Pauling Institute (LPI), established in 1996 at Oregon State University, **aims to help people achieve a healthy and productive life**, full of vitality, with minimal suffering, and free of cancer and other debilitating diseases. In June 2007, USANA expanded its partnership with LPI in an effort to better determine the function and role of vitamins, minerals, and antioxidants (micronutrients) in promoting optimal health and preventing disease. **USANA will contribute \$500,000 US per year to the institute over the next decade.** USANA and LPI expanded their relationship with hopes to build on Dr. Linus Pauling's legacy. Dr. Pauling, who died in 1994 at age 93, was considered one of the most influential chemists of the 20th century and was **the only individual ever to receive two unshared Nobel prizes.**
